# 3 Different Populations of Indigenous peoples in Canada:

- Inuit: live primarily in northern Canada/the Arctic; unique languages
- **Metis:** distinct from other Indigenous people; live primarily on Metis Settlements
- **First Nations:** Live both on First Nations and in urban areas.

Socioeconomic Status- median income on First Nation \$20,357.00 (2020); below national average # of communities in Canada: 634 First Nation communities in Canada # of Indigenous People in Canada 1.67 million








